**GATEWAY COURSE:** SPAN 261 (Advanced Spanish in Context) or 267 (Advanced Spanish in Context for Heritage Learners).

- SPAN 261 or 267 should be taken before SPAN 300.
- The requirements below consist of eight courses between SPAN 300 and SPAN 699.
- Although LING 101 does not count towards the major, it is highly recommended to take this course prior to taking upper-level Spanish linguistics courses (courses numbered between SPAN 360 and SPAN 699).

The requirements are as follows:

**8 COURSES REQUIRED IN MAJOR (24 credit hours):**

1. SPAN 300 Spanish Composition and Grammar Review. \_\_\_\_\_ 1
2. Two introductory Hispanic linguistics courses:

3. Two specialized Hispanic linguistics courses: SPAN 375, 378, 397, 677, 678, 679, 680, 682, or 683 and one of these courses must be a 600-level course. \_\_\_\_\_
4. One course in a language relevant to Spanish: SPAN 414, 416, or PORT 401. \_\_\_\_\_
5. Two additional courses chosen from SPAN 338, 340, 344, 361, 371, 373, 375, 378, 397, 415, 417, PORT 402, SPAN 676, 677, 678, 679, 680, 682 or 683 \_\_\_\_\_

<sup>1</sup> If you placed out of SPAN 300, please note that the designation of SPAN 300 - PL on your transcript carries zero credit hours. You are still required by UNC policy to complete the required number of 24 credit hours for your Hispanic Linguistics Major. You must therefore take an additional course that counts towards the major to replace SPAN 300.
